If the Bible is truly God's Word, then it has authority over our lives. But if it's just a human invention, then it loses its power and purpose. Think about how we determine if something is trustworthy. Whether it's a person, a news source, or even an old story passed down through generations, we usually ask: **Where did it come from? Is it accurate? And does it hold up over time?** As we discuss, let's be open to both what we already believe and what we might need to wrestle with.

2. What do you think is the message of the Bible?
3. What are some of the cultural blinders or filters that affect the way we interpret the world?
4. How might those filters affect the way one interprets the Bible? How do they affect you personally?
5. Read **Luke 24:25-27**. What does Jesus say all of the Scriptures are about?
6. Why might it be good news if the Bible is all about Jesus and not about us?
7. What is the impact of the Bible's authority and applicability on followers of Jesus?
8. Close your time in prayer, and ask that God would strengthen our confidence in His Word and help us live in response to it.
